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**ORDER:**

In his letter second read above, the Head of the Department, Animal Husbandry Department, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad, has reported that the Government, issued CBRO through the reference 1<sup>st</sup> cited, read above in which sanctions were given only for major schemes without indicating sanction for all other sub-components of the major schemes as proposed by the department. Specific sanction of sub-components of the major schemes will facilitate the Head of the Department to successfully implement all the programmes prioritized by the Government in Districts which will also avoid the audit objection by the Accountant General while inspecting the departmental activities. He has furnished the detailed guidelines and financial implications for implementation of the schemes and requested the Government to issue separate Administrative sanction orders in respect of the schemes prioritized by the department for implementation of various schemes during 2016-17.

2. After careful examination of the proposals of the Head of the Department, Animal Husbandry Department, Andhra Pradesh, Hyderabad, Government hereby accord Administrative approval in respect of sub components of major schemes prioritized by the department along with financial implications as detailed below for implementing the schemes during the current financial year 2016-17.

**ANNEXURE to G.O.Rt. No. AHDD&F(AH.I) Department, dated:22.07.2016**

**General guidelines:**

- Selection of the beneficiaries shall be based on transparent procedures with proper documentation, and arrangements shall be made for real time monitoring of data through web based application.
- The identification of selected beneficiaries shall be aadhar based (optional) with Bank account No. / Any other identifiable parameter.
- Priority shall be given to SC, ST farmers in selection of the beneficiaries wherever feasible.
- The physical and financial targets indicated for each of the sub components under the same head of account are interchangeable as per the need and acceptability of the scheme among farmers.
- Impact assessment shall be made before and after implementation of the programme.
- The Head of the Department shall utilize the grant as per implementable work plan within the overall ceilings of the quarterly budget entitled to the department to achieve the targets.
- He shall also implement PPP projects in the department with due approval of the Government.
- For all the existing schemes, the guidelines already issued by the Government / HOD are applicable in this financial year also. Any modifications now issued shall supersede the earlier guidelines.
- For all the new schemes, the detailed guidelines if any, communicated by the Government / HOD as per need after issue of this shall also be followed.

**Detailed guidelines with financial allocation:**

**1. Artificial Insemination Centres (Cattle & Buffalo Breed Development):**

**Head of Account: 2403-00-102-11-06-310/312**

**Total amount allocated: Rs.500.00 lakh**

**i . New AI centres (Coverage of Additional breeding stock through NGO):**

- It is a new scheme.
- Meant for expansion of breeding operations involving NGOs with experience in implementation of livestock projects
- The integrated livestock development centres shall be established in uncovered areas where there are no facilities established for breeding operations by the department.
- 1000 Breedable cattle shall be covered per each centre which may increase or decrease marginally as per ground feasibility
- Shall be implemented through MOU approved by the Government.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.200.00 Lakh.

## **ii. Promotion of Indigenous Breeds:**

- It is an existing scheme.
- This is a breed improvement activity taken up for conservation of Desi cows and promotion of sustainable Organic farming.
- Rs.10000/- per animal is provided towards transportation and insurance premium for Indigenous Animals (GIR, Shahiwal etc.) purchased by the farmers. The guidelines already issued by the Government vide G.O.RT.No.20 of AH, DD & F (AH.I) Dept. Dated:22.01.2016 shall be followed.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.200.00 Lakh.

## **iii. Interest Subsidy for Dairy farms:**

- It is a new scheme.
- Designed to promote entrepreneurs in dairy farming for establishment of new Dairy farms / Expansion of existing Dairy farms in the state.
- Interest subsidy shall be provided over and above 3% interest charged by the banks.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.50.00 Lakh.

## **iv. Sexed Semen/Sexed semen Lab/ ET lab:**

- It is a new scheme.
- To be implemented in selected pockets of the state involving AP livestock Development Agency (APLDA).
- 5000 doses of sexed semen shall be procured and piloted to produce additional female calves.
- Subsidy on each dose of sexed semen is 75% and the remaining 25% of the cost of sexed semen shall be borne by the concerned beneficiary.
- Sexed Semen shall be supplied to farmers on first cum first serve basis.
- Funds allocated to this activity are also meant for training the staff within or outside the state for implementation of the activity.
- Funds can also be utilized for import of superior quality embryos (HF, Jersey etc.)
- Funds can also be utilized for Establishment of Sexed semen lab/ Embryo Transfer Technology (ET) lab.
- Implementing agency is Andhra Pradesh Livestock Development Agency (APLDA)
- Financial Out lay - Rs.50.00 Lakh.

## **2. Feed and fodder Development:**

**Head of Account: 2403-00-107-11-04-310/312**

**Total amount allocated is Rs.7051.00 lakh**

- To implement the provisions of FODDER SECURITY POLICY, the Head of the Department is permitted to implement certain new & innovative schemes besides continuing the ongoing schemes to achieve self-reliance in feed and fodder production. The sub components of the main activity are given below.

### **i. Promotion of Silage**

- It is an ongoing scheme.

- To make sure the availability of nutritious green fodder to the livestock throughout the year the Department shall promote silage production activity in the form of bales / pit silage / tower silo / Bunkers etc.
- The activity shall be implemented through involvement of farmers / entrepreneurs / NGO / SERP / PPP partners / any other agency.
- To increase the scope of activity, the programme shall be implemented in convergence with other schemes.
- Shall be promoted in PPP mode wherever possible.
- The existing subsidy pattern shall be followed and the beneficiary contribution @Rs2/- per kg silage shall be borne by the concerned beneficiary.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.1238.00 Lakh.

#### **ii. Hydroponics & Azolla:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- The Hydroponics technology shall be promoted to enable the farmers to produce green fodder where there is constraint for land to grow fodder.
- Azolla, an algae shall be promoted as an alternative to replaced oiled cakes in the concentrate feed to some extent to reduce cost of production in the Livestock Production.
- 75% subsidy for Hydroponics units and 90% subsidy for Azolla units shall be extended to the beneficiaries as per the provisions of fodder security policy and the remaining non subsidy component shall be born by the concerned beneficiaries.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.500.00 Lakh.

#### **iii. TMR Fodder blocks:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- To enable farmers to get access to the balanced / complete ration to the animals in the form of blocks, particularly those farmers who do not own land (for fodder production) to enable them confidently to take up dairying activity.
- The concept is known to reduce production costs.
- Shall be promoted in PPP mode.
- The existing subsidy pattern shall be followed and the beneficiary contribution @ Rs.3.50 Ps per kg of TMR Fodder block shall be borne by the concerned beneficiary.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.1000.00 Lakh.

#### **iv. Convergence with MGNREGS to match for material cost:**

- It is a new scheme.
- The scheme is meant to Promote large scale fodder production in convergence with Rural Development Department.
- The AH department shall provide matching funds of material component over and above the 40% material cost involved under MGNREGS.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.1000.00 Lakh.

**v. Ration Balancing Programme(RBP):**

- It is a new scheme.
- Shall be promoted to create awareness amongst the milk producers for optimization of milk production by efficient utilization of locally available feeding resources.
- The concept is known to reduce production costs.
- Shall be implemented involving entrepreneurs Gopalmitras / Department staff / NGO / any other agency.
- The grant earmarked for the scheme shall be utilised to equip the resource persons with required tools and also to offer performance base incentive of Rs.50/- per animal.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.1000.00 Lakh.

**vi. Fodder Seed Supply:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- Shall supply improved fodder seed to the farmers to take up large scale fodder production to meet the fodder requirement of high yielding animals.
- The fodder seed shall be supplied on 75% subsidy to the farmers.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.500.00 Lakh.

**vii. Fodder Banks:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- Storage facilities for fodder shall be created in strategic locations to supply fodder to livestock farmers in scarcity periods.
- Infrastructure facilities shall be provided by the Department through RIDF / under MGNREGS (in convergence with Rural Development Department) / under state development plan
- Shall be managed by the Department / PPP partners / SERP / FPO on mutually agreeable terms and conditions.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.200.00 Lakh.

**viii. Feed and fodder supply:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- Shall supply feed and fodder of different categories to the farmers / Goshalas on subsidy basis @Rs.2/- per kg of Silage @Rs.3/- per kg of dry fodder and @Rs.3.50/- per kg of TMR fodder blocks and Rs.4/-per kg of concentrate feed irrespective of their procurement cost throughout the year / critical period as part of initiative to achieve double digit growth in livestock sector.
- Preference shall be given for supply of silage bale / TMR fodder block to the farmers.
- Preference shall be given for supply of Silage bales / TMR blocks / conc. Feed / Dry fodder to Goshalas on subsidized cost to prevent distress and also to Government livestock farms on reimbursement basis during critical periods.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.1613.00 Lakh.

**3. Implementation of Livestock Stock Development Programmes:  
(Management / Healthcare)**



- **Head of Account: 2403-00-800-11-09-310/312**
- **Total amount allocated is Rs.2000.00 lakh.**

**i) Pregnant and Lactating Animal care (Ksheerasaagar):**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- Designed to reduce inter calving period in milch animals and to increase the life time milk production.
- The feed & fodder, healthcare and insurance support including other logistics shall be given for a period of six months (Last 3 months of pregnancy and first 3 months of lactation).
- An additional 360 litres of milk and one extra calf can be obtained from each animal in its life time.
- The scheme shall be implemented on 75% subsidy.
- The logistics including data entry shall be on 100% subsidy.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.1000.00 Lakh.

**ii) Animal Hostel:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- The scheme is to create basic infrastructure facilities needed for integration of dairy activity with biogas production, vermi compost, value addition to milk etc.,
- Scientific feeding and management of group of milch animals maintained at common location under the technical supervision of veterinarian in order to optimize milk production.
- Common infrastructure facilities required for animal management, dung & urine management shall be provided free of cost, working capital in the form of revolving fund shall also be provided.
- Shall be implemented in convergence mode with RD department involving SHGs/unemployed youth/ Dairies / NGOs, etc.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.50.00 Lakh.

**iii) Suphalam:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- To get one calf once in 15-18 months from milch animals /heifers through fertility Management of infertile animals.
- One village shall be adopted by the field functionaries where the incidence of infertility problem is high to tackle infertility.
- The provision available under this sub-component can also be utilised to tie-up medicines required for the animals covered under Ksheerasaagar scheme and to meet logistics.
- All infertile animals available in the target villages shall be identified through screening of animals and appropriate treatment package shall be given under the supervision of a graduate veterinarian till the animal is conceived or advised for culling.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.50.00 Lakh.

**iv) Organization of Janmabhoomi – Mavooru programme:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- Animal health camps shall be conducted in all the Grampanchayats / mandal of the state. The activities broadly shall be deworming, vaccinations, fertility management, treatment of sick animals, technology transfer, capacity building, plantation of fodder trees in all possible locations under neeru-chettu / polampilustondi etc.
- As the camps are exclusively organized by the departmental staff in the early hours or in the late evenings, the HOD shall engage vehicles for mobility @ one vehicle/ mandal for the period as & when announced by the Government.
- The rates fixed for hiring of vehicles shall be as per rules and procedures in vogue.
- The amount earmarked for the activity shall also be used to meet the logistics for successful conduct of the programme.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.500.00 Lakh.

**v) Mobile Veterinary Services (NTR Sanchara Pashu Vydy Sevalu)**

- It is a new scheme.
- The Mobile Veterinary Services (NTR SPS) shall provide service to the farmers in the state, at the rate of one each per Animal Husbandry division for 45 divisions in the first phase.
- Can gradually extend the number to (180) erstwhile blocks based on the feedback on the utility of the scheme.
- Shall be implemented involving entrepreneurs / NGO / any other agency in PPP mode.
- The amount earmarked for this activity shall also be used to assist NGO/PPP partner as grants in aid to operate the scheme.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.400.00 Lakh

**4. Infrastructure support to Dairy/Sheep/Poultry Sector:**

- **Head of Account: 4403 -00-101-11-05-520/521 & 4403 -00-101-11-05-530/531**
- **Total amount allocated is Rs.4000.00 lakh**

**i) BMCU in potential villages:**

- It is an ongoing scheme
- The grant in shall be used to establish BMCU in potential villages involving APDDCF / Private dairies/ Dairy unions / SERP / FPO to increase the shelf life of the milk and to minimize the losses to milk producers.
- Promotes clean milk production concept.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.500.00 Lakh.

**ii) Milk processing units / equipment:**

- It is an ongoing scheme.
- Milk processing units / equipment shall be established in uncovered areas involving APDDCF / Private dairies/ Dairy unions / SERP / FPO or involving entrepreneurs to promote local sales.

- Financial Out lay - Rs.1250.00 Lakh

**iii) Support to Farmer Producer Organisation (FPO):**

- It is a new scheme.
- Shall promote formation of Farmer Interest Groups (FIG) and FPO.
- The grant earmarked for this activity shall be used to provide assistance towards technical inputs, Infrastructure support and consultancy services to establish market linkages.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.200.00 Lakh

**iv) Milk Market Outlets:**

- It is a new scheme.
- The grant earmarked shall be used to establish outlets involving APDDCF / Private dairies/ Dairy unions / SERP / FPO or involving entrepreneurs to promote local marketing of milk and milk products.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.50.00 Lakh

**v) Breeding rams production / replacement and exchange:**

- It is a new scheme.
- The grant earmarked for the activity shall be utilised to sensitize the rearers on improved breeding practices such as ram/ buck production for replacement once in 2 years to check in-breeding.
- Suitable activities such as Ram / Buck exchange events with incentivization for such exchanges shall be promoted with a policy support.
- To increase meat production through induction of 5+1 or 20+1 Sheep / Goat units as decided by the department as per local needs.
- The unit cost shall be Rs.1,00,000/- for 20+1 unit and Rs.30,000/- for 5+1 unit.
- Exchange melas shall also be organized taking mandal / blocks as unit where all the interested shepherds shall meet at one place and exchange their rams for which the required support can be extended from this grant.
- The provision available under this component shall be utilised towards transportation charges, insurance, feed incentive of 50 kgs each, cash incentive of Rs.500/- each to both the shepherds covered under exchange programme including the logistics required for organization of the exchange.
- The fund under this component can also be utilised to produce Breeding Rams with buy back tie up.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.500.00 Lakh

**vi) Avikabandhu:**

- It is a new scheme.
- Shall train the Small Ruminant rearers in latest sheep husbandry practices (community owned youth trained in extension and first aid).
- Avika Bandhu shall be trained and supported through FPO's in skill development programmes to provide services like deworming, vaccination etc.,
- NRC on meat shall be involved to impart training to the butchers.

- Financial Out lay - Rs.50.00 Lakh.

**vii) Sheep Shelters:**

- It is a new scheme.
- High mortality and morbidity rates in small ruminants are partly due to lack of proper housing particularly during rainy season.
- Large scale promotion of sheep shelters shall be in convergence with Rural Development Department.
- The AH department shall provide matching funds of material component over and above the 40% material cost involved under MGNREGS.
- The required funds shall be provided through this scheme to those shepherds who do not fit into MGNREGS norms.
- Portable models of shelters shall also be promoted for the benefit of migratory flocks on subsidy to check lamb mortality.
- The shelters including mobile sheep shelters shall be supported on 50% subsidy.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.200.00 Lakh

**viii) Interest subsidy for setting up of new Sheep / Goat farms:**

- It is a new scheme.
- The Farmers Producers Organizations (FPOs) shall be strengthened to mobilize institutional credit to its members to support for establishment of sheep / goat farms.
- This fund can also be utilised to extend interest subsidy to entrepreneurs who wish to establish new sheep / goat farms.
- The Government shall give interest subsidy over and above 3% interest charged by the banks on capital investment.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.100.00 Lakh

**ix) Feeding support to pregnant ewes:**

- It is a new scheme.
- Shall provide 75% subsidy on the feeding cost, 100% subsidy on health care of pregnant ewes / does during the last 2 months of pregnancy in the form of silage and concentrate feed.
- Shall be implemented only in those villages where the breeding Rams/Bucks production activity is designed by the department.
- Financial Out lay - Rs.200.00 Lakh

**x) Community managed Sheep insurance:**

- It is a new scheme.
